


Low Net


Allow close engagement to the net, playable visibility as users walk in between them.






Medium Net

A compact "ceiling", creates an invisible boundary or space as people walks below it.





High Net

A high overhead installation that spans like a floating cloud "umbrella-ing" the site.

Arcux performs as a visualizer of the wind with constant motion and harvests wind energy through its constant momentum.

The net sculpture suspended at a varying height range between 1–20m, the cables design allows the object to take the wind from all directions and maximize the energy harvesting efficiency. The vertical supports are the surrounding light poles with minimal construction requirement on the site, contradicting the traditional wind energy generation with heavy construction work.

Arcux will become a symbolic sculpture to St Kilda, building a brighter renewable energy future for the city's public space and transportation, given a new fluid language to the city's vivid and lively neighbourhood. During the day, the sculpture respond to the wind choreography; the night celebrates with spotlights as its surrounding Victorian night life comes alive; gathering backpackers and families into the St. Kilda Triangle.
