Together, these elements form a self-sustaining sanctuary where sunlight, water, and life converge a living testament to the balance between human ingenuity and the natural world. This keeps the symbolic weight while sounding natural and elegant in Fijian. It evokes imagery of nurturing, creation, and life-sustaining power coming from a garden a powerful metaphor in Fijian and Pacific cultures.
