

Waqa Ni Rarama: The Canoe of Light

Taking its name from the Fijian phrase for "Canoe of Light," the project serves as a grounded response to rising seas, disappearing traditions, and disconnection from nature. Its hull-like frame is wrapped in shimmering solar fins; its base functions as both a public gathering platform and environmental learning hub. Beneath the sails, people gather not only for shelter, but for storytelling, stewardship, and systems thinking.





Beacon of Climate Resilience

Waqa Ni Rarama rises from the Fijian highlands as a sculptural fusion of Indigenous design, clean technology, and ecological education. Inspired by the iconic drua canoe, this installation channels ancestral knowledge into a radiant structure that harvests sunlight, collects rainwater, and brings communities together under a shared canopy of innovation and tradition.
