



Rooted in the spirit of Marou Village and inspired by the floral landscapes of Fiji, Sere ni Siga (Song of the Sun) is a regenerative energy pavilion designed as a blossoming solar canopy.

Each petal structure unfurls skyward, clad with high-efficiency photovoltaic panels altogether generate 3 kW (per structure) of clean energy—meeting the village’s essential needs while symbolizing harmony with nature.

Beneath its canopy, the structure collects rainwater, offers shelter, and becomes a shared place for the community.

The design is modular to make construction simple and to make transportation easy and is made with simple materials (marine-grade plywood and steel bracketing). The surface decoration and structure was inspired by the form of a kava bowl obtained in our last visit to Suva.
