

how it's used, it is meant to pay tribute to the Paiute tribe, their Elders (past, present & future), their ancestors' simple way of life in ca. 18th century, and the land - revered by them - on which the structure will be located.

We've also visualized the metamorphosis of the Blade Monument into other useful forms of blade-based shelters (all of them using end-of-life wind turbine blades) that echo the spirit of "leave no trace" in the context of a post-carbon FlyRanch of tomorrow.

With the obvious exception of the Blade Monument, everything else in our architectural design is human scale, demonstrating a strong connection of the structures - and the people using them - to the earth, air/wind, sun and water.
